Kindness and respect

We are proud of our caring and compassionate college community; and work hard to ensure that every person is treated with kindness and respect.

We care deeply about each and every one of our students and want them to feel fulfilled, confident, happy and safe within our college community. We ensure this by having a very high level of pastoral care, so every student is valued, listened to, and cared for so that they can thrive. Through assemblies, our Values curriculum and tutor time, we promote our college values, which in turn nurture a strong sense of community, trust, respect and belonging.

Each student belongs to a House (Christie, Durrell, Lewis, Orwell, Tolkien) and a tutor group within their year group. Tutors are the first point of contact for parents/carers and meet with their tutees at the start of every day. Each year group has a Head of Learning and a Head of Learning Support who provide pastoral support and expertise and academic challenge and expectations.

A caring college community means we don't tolerate bullying. Our students feel incredibly safe, knowing who to report issues to and knowing that matters will be dealt with quickly and effectively.

We have the highest expectations of how our students and staff treat each other and believe wholeheartedly in the importance of good manners, so that together every member of our community is treated with kindness and respect.





Aspiration and pride

We encourage our students to be aspirational in their ambitions; and to take pride in everything they do.

In return we open their eyes to the world around them; give them the confidence to believe anything is possible; and a platform of opportunities from which to fly.

It is important to us that our students take pride in their work, their achievements, their appearance and the college and its environment and recognise the invaluable contribution they make to our college community. We support students to recognise how their day to day actions speak volumes and are influential in defining their future; so that together we set aspirational goals and take pride in the small steps we take each and every day to reach them.

We reward students on a daily, weekly and half termly basis for their attendance, for demonstrating the college values, and for their achievements, through tutor, Head of Learning and Headteacher's awards. We also celebrate a Student of the Month and a Team of the Term, as well as hosting termly Awards assemblies and annual Arts and Sports Awards.



Curriculum

Our curriculum is broad and balanced yet aspirational and personalised, with students studying all core and foundation subjects of the National Curriculum.

Our KS3 curriculum is knowledge rich and gives students a range of experiences and opportunities to help them develop into well rounded, curious life-long learners who are aspirational and determined to make the most of their strengths and talents. Most importantly, the KS3 curriculum contains real challenge and rigour, incorporating our college values and building the academic foundations for KS4, KS5 and further study. All students study either French or Spanish from Year 7 and continue with this language through to GCSE as part of our commitment to providing our students with the best educational opportunities and outcomes by studying the English Baccalaureate at KS4. We offer an extensive and ever-evolving range of clubs and educational visits and events to enhance our students' educational experience, as well as homework clubs and targeted intervention classes to support academic achievement.

We believe the lesson content of our curriculum is essential to developing the whole student. Personal, social and health education, including Relationship, Sex Education and Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development are taught in our Values lessons. Students are prepared for the opportunities and responsibilities of adult life from as early as Year 7, through a progressive careers element of our curriculum that supports students to make informed choices about KS4 preferences and develop realistic yet ambitious aspirations.

The curriculum is allocated across a two-week timetable, in which there are 25 hours of lessons each week, all an hour long. The allocation per subject at KS3 is summarised below.

At KS4 students study a core curriculum of English Language, English Literature, Maths, Combined Science, Physical Education and World Values (non-examined) in addition to choosing four option subjects, which include a language (for most students) and either History or Geography. Students can opt to study: Computer Science, IMedia, Drama, Art, Photography, Music, Performing Arts, Media Studies, Psychology, Health & Social Care, Construction, Spanish, French, History, Geography, Triple Science, Business Studies, Food Nutrition, Design Technology, Further Maths, Statistics, and Philosophy, Religion & Ethics.

























Enrichment

We offer our students the chance to experience the world around them; a world outside the classroom that is full of opportunities that will shape their development and future.

At Newton Abbot College we believe that enrichment opportunities are a vitally important part of every student's educational experience because they increase opportunities, maximise outcomes and improve life chances by developing students' confidence and creating positive mindsets. Our opportunities start immediately with the Year 7 residential which is a fantastic opportunity for students to push themselves, try new activities and develop lasting friendships.

Activities Week runs every year for all students in Years 7 - 10 and offers an exciting opportunity for students to take on new challenges and experience different environments, such as surfing in Cornwall, abseiling in the Brecon Beacons and horse riding on Dartmoor.


All Year 10 and 12 students take part in a work experience placement so they can experience the world of work and recognise how college prepares them for the skills and knowledge they need to be successful in later life.

We invite all students to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award and the Ten Tors Challenge as these amazing opportunities help develop students' resilience and stamina, and their team-building and map-reading skills. We organise local, regional and national visits that inspire and engage young minds, for example, visits to the Eden Project and Paignton Zoo, London's West End and to the art galleries of Berlin. We host a programme of guest speaker events and workshops within college so that our students can be inspired about their future alongside developing an understanding of the issues that we face in the world around us.

Our Performing Arts concerts and productions are hugely popular and give students the chance to work backstage or be in the limelight – the perfect platform for any budding performer. We have a range of college bands that aspiring musicians and vocalists can join who rehearse together to perform at college events.

We have an annual calendar of life-changing, overseas opportunities that includes a skiing trip; visits to Spain and France; and expeditions to far-reaching destinations such as Borneo and Tanzania.

To ensure that all students experience the wider curriculum, our enrichment programme is carefully mapped so that we provide quality enrichment activities for all students. We continuously monitor engagement and uptake, so that a broad range of enriching activities are on offer.



Creating a strong culture and college community

It's important to us that our students make a valuable contribution to their local community; that they are aware of the world in which they live and understand the need to look after others.

Over the last ten years, Newton Abbot College has played an important role in raising money for local and national charities and the determined efforts of our students and staff have enabled the college to make substantial annual donations to a variety of fantastic causes. We are proud to have supported many charities including Dartmoor Rescue, Place2Be, Julian House, Jay's Aim and Above Water, raising over £75,800 in total since 2015.
